Qualities of a “Good” questionnaire

1. The responses to the questionnaire help meet the objectives of the research
2. It has high reliability & validity
3. It is easy for the users to take
 - Easy to understand
 - Maintains the users’ interest throughout the questionnaire
4. It is easy to administer
5. It is easy to analyze

Steps in developing a questionnaire, interview, or focus group

5. Develop the question wording.

- Question considerations
 - Can the user answer the question?
 - Are there external events that bias the answers?
 - Is there ambiguity in the question?
 - Are the questions leading/loading?
 - Are there implied alternatives in the question?
 - Are there 2 questions in the question?
 - Have you asked everything?
